Early Years Foundation Stage (Reception class) results 2018.

<u>Percentage of pupils with a GOOD LEVEL OF DEVELOPMENT (G.L.D.)</u>	G.L.D. is the main national benchmark used for Reception class progress.

This is the fourth consecutive year that the school has been above or well above national results in early years' assessments.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check 2018.

At the end of the first year of the national curriculum (Year 1), pupils are given an external screening assessment, to see if they know their phonics (i.e. the sounds and letters that make up the English language).

Every year, the school has been above or well above the national average with our highest score ever this year as you can see below.

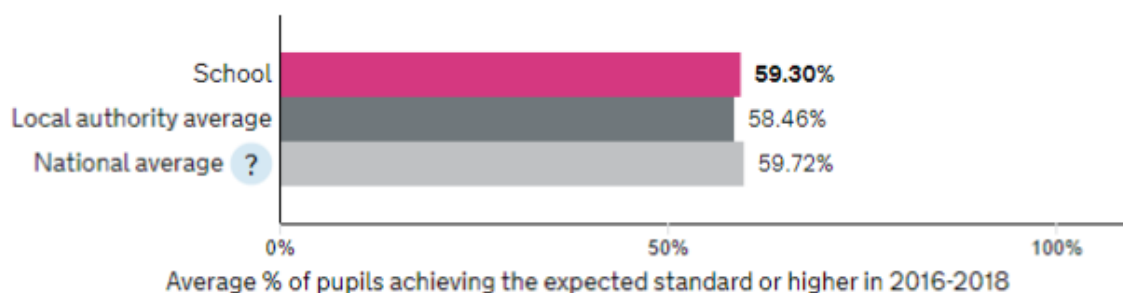
Good attainment results against the new more rigorous standards in Literacy at St Mary's in 2018. We had a combined rise of 2% to be in line with national for the third year in a row (up 10% since 2016). Maths results were up 11% this year, just below national – just one pupil (3%) less than national. However, the school is part of the exciting Cheshire Mathematics Reasoning Project, and improvements in learning & teaching, alongside tracking and progress data in school this year, show that we are aiming high for 2019. No pupils achieved a high level in 2018 in all three subjects combined – ie. reading, writing and maths. However 20% achieved a high level in the reading test and 10% in the Maths tests.

Reading	-0.66	Confidence interval	-2.9 to 1.5
Writing	-2.75	Confidence interval	-4.9 to -0.7
Maths	-2.68	Confidence interval	-4.7 to -0.7

Confidence levels indicate that, with small cohorts like ours, no-one can be quite certain within the interval where the actual score lies.
